Meet Our Team - Our Organisation

In September, we will have 25 children in our class.

We have lots of classroom space, a nurture space, library, garden and play space and huge grounds to explore.

Miss Gotts will be your child's class teacher, helped by our lovely support staff.

All children will get to work with all our staff every day.



How does Reception work?

Teaching in Reception is organised through a range of approaches and provides a balance of child initiated and adult led activities.

Opportunities for adults to work alongside children as they develop their interests in particular areas of the curriculum.

Small group teaching of early reading and writing through our phonics programme Little Wandle.

Planned focused activities, where adults work with a small group of children at a time.

Whole class teaching for short periods of time, such as shared story time, songs, rhymes, talking time, as well as direct teaching, such as, Maths, Phonics and Literacy

We will adapt and differentiate the activity to meet the needs of all children.

Our Curriculum What will we be learning?

Our curriculum is what we want our children to learn in the time they are with us.

We use the statutory early years foundation stage (EYFS) and teach through the 7 different areas of learning.

We will teach a language rich curriculum, using a multitude of texts and stories at the heart of our learning. We will weave in our children's interests and follow their lines of enquiry.

We will teach a variety of themes, such as Keeping Healthy, Minibeasts and Going on a Journey.

We use Little Wandle to teach phonics and early reading. More information will be shared in September.

We use White Rose to teach our Maths curriculum, which is practical and immersive.

Throughout Reception we will be working towards meeting the Early Learning Goals across the 7 areas of learning.

Early Reading

Reading is at the heart of our curriculum. Children read out loud frequently from carefully selected books that closely match their phonic knowledge.

Story time is a valued part of our daily routine. We recognise it as essential in developing children's language, vocabulary and comprehension. Language is a priority,

We work to embed spoken language, vocabulary development and listening comprehension of the second second



We teach reading in a systematic and structured way, building up phonic knowledge and skills explicitly through Little Wandle.

We create a love of reading that will stay with your child throughout their life. We need your help to foster this at home by sharing stories with your child.

We read in small groups, either with a Teacher or Teaching Assistant, at least, three times a week. The book we read in school will then be sent home for you to listen to your child read at home, at least another three times. Book bags and reading planners must be in school every day please.

Reading books will be changed once a week with one phonically decodable book to be read throughout the week and a take home, sharing book which is chosen by your child as well-



Our Learning Environment

Our learning environment will always promote a calm, nurturing space.

Our environment is always purposeful and will reflect all areas of learning and the topic being covered at the time. We have continuous provision and enhanced provision.

All of our resources will be accessible to our children to encourage independence. Children become confident in how to support themselves in their learning throughout the year.

Materials are thoughtfully added to the environment to promote creativity, thinking and problem-solving skills, questions, experimentation and open-ended play.



A typical day in Reception

Arrive in school and lots of time to talk to friends or read stories together. We start our day in our outdoor area.

Dough Disco, Scarf Disco and Pen Disco.

Phonics session (20 Mins) and extra catch-up sessions in the day

Phonics session (20 Mins) and extra catch-up sessions in the day to support all children.

Getting busy time, time to explore the environment and lead their own learning, indoors and outdoors.

Snack time and together talk.

Guided reading with an adult 3 times a week.

Lunch time and playing in the playground.

Maths Session, lots of songs and practical activities.

PE lessons/Music/Understanding of the world/Circle times/Art.

Lots of play and busy time indoors and outdoors.

Focused group or individual time with an adult throughout the week.

Protected Story time every day.



In Reception

Milk

Every day, children will have the opportunity to have a carton of milk.

Fruit and vegetables Every day, free fruit/vegetables are provided for snack time. This is an excellent way for children to eat one of their 5-a-day!

Water Every day, children should bring their (labelled) water bottle The bottle should contain water, not juice.
