

## A COUPLE OF REMINDERS

**Healthy Snacks** – All children in Early Years, Y1 and Y2 are provided with a free healthy snack each morning playtime. Children in KS2 can bring a healthy snack to school for morning breaktimes from home. Suggestions of healthy snacks are: Malt loaf, fruit: fresh and dried (please cut grapes in half to help prevent choking), cereal bars (not with nuts or chocolate), crispbread, crackers, diced cheese, sunflower seeds, raisins, vegetable sticks: carrots, pepper slices, sugar snap peas. Children seen with less healthy snacks, such as crisps and chocolate bars for morning break snack, will be asked to put them away in their bag to take home again.

We do believe in everything in moderation, however please leave unhealthier snacks for enjoying at home. Thank you.

**Important:** Due to a range of allergies, snacks and packed lunches **must not contain nuts or products that contain nuts, such as peanut butter.** We have a number of children and staff in school with nut allergies, which could be fatal if they come into contact with nuts. Thank you.

**Parking** - Parents/Carers are expected to park in a safe and considerate manner. Please do not park across our neighbours driveways, on the double yellow lines, across the pavements or on the access road to our school at the front of the building (this is an emergency route and needs to be kept clear at all times). Our school car park is for staff only (with the exception of anyone who is eligible to use our disabled car parking space).

If you are parking in the secondary school car park: Rossett School, then please do so responsibly. I have already had concerns brought to me about double parking, parking in the disabled spaces when not eligible to do so, and even someone parking so close to another car that the parent couldn't get her younger child (not at school yet) out of the car in order to drop her older child into school. It is due to the generosity of Rossett School that parents are able to use their car park at drop off and pick up time – please don't put this in jeopardy. Thank you.

**School grounds, including Trim Trail and Bridge** – We love our school grounds and are very lucky to have such wonderful facilities to use during school time. However, due to insurance, supervision and health and safety issues, the school grounds should not be used by children, including younger and older siblings, before and after school; this includes playing on the Trim Trail, Bridge and playing football.

We would really appreciate your help and support with these matters. Thank you.

#### **PUPIL PREMIUM**

You may not be aware but free school meals are available to all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils and to children whose parents receive certain benefits.

You could save up to £450 a year with free school meals for your child. School meals can also save you time and provide peace of mind that your child is enjoying a healthy, fresh, and nutritious meal at lunchtime. Children who are entitled to free school meals can also receive subsidised school trips, music lessons etc. If your circumstances have changed or if you have a household income of less than £16,190 you may be eligible.
