On Monday in assembly, I showed the children two short Buddhist video stories. One about 'Siddhartha and the Swan' and the other about 'The Monkey King.'

I then asked the children retrieval questions to ascertain good listening and we discussed values – those of our Trust/School and those of the main characters in the story.

The children were able to share how they could use the value of compassion/being kind to others throughout our school day eg. asking someone to play at playtime if they didn't have anyone to play with, helping others pick up items if they had fallen on the floor, being kind to others and treating them the way we would want to be treated (our Golden Rule), looking after others etc.

GIRLS FOOTBALL DAY

To support their equal access ambition for girls to play football, The FA will host their third #LetGirlsPlay Biggest Ever Football Session on **Friday**, **8th March** 2024 (International Women's Day).
